What does a day working at the reef look like for you? Every day on the Ningaloo is different. At different times of the season, we can see whale sharks, whales, manta rays, dolphins, turtles, dugongs and a variety of fish and corals. Typically my day ends with a sea of happy smiling (slightly sunburnt) faces having had an amazing day exploring the magic of Ningaloo Reef.

What is your favourite part about working at the reef? Seeing the joy it brings to visitors!

In your opinion, what is the state of the reef? Ningaloo is very healthy; there are a number of unique snorkel sites, a huge variety of fish and corals and megafauna.

Minimise plastic use, be careful when they are boating and snorkelling / diving on the reef
